STUDY TOUR PROGRAMS AT PARAFIELD GARDEN HIGH SCHOOL

Parafield Garden High School hosts short term visits of one to two weeks for groups of students from overseas schools. Programs are tailored for each group and involve a variety of English experience and subjects.

In August 2024 we are very excited to be welcoming back Japanese students.

Students are preferably hosted by families within the school the local community. Homestay families are required to provide accommodation and meals, transport drop and pick up from the school each day, provide packed lunch meals and snacks during school days (schools will manage its homestay student tour).

The accreditation process involves:

- A staff member from our international program visiting your home to check suitability for having a student and provide the information about Study Tours.
- All members in the house over age of 18 needs to have a valid Working With Children check (WWCC)
- One member of the Family to have completed the Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect- Education and care (RRHAN_EC) training which is two hour online course.



Benefits of Hosting a Home Stay Student

- Hosting a home stay student gives you the opportunity to share your culture and learn about theirs.
- Homestay students gives you an opportunity to practice your communication skills with a native speaker, while also helping them improve their English.
- Earn an extra money as a Host Family.
- Gain an international network of friends.

*The Schools will arrange for any screenings required and cover the costs involved.
